

Carleton-Willard Preparedness Response to COVID-19

The news about the spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) and the potential risks it presents is concerning to all of us. Please know that maintaining our residents' and staff's health, wellness and safety is our number one priority.

Currently, the Village has no active COVID-19 positive cases.

Surveillance testing of staff according to guidance from the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (MDPH) and Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) continues to be done weekly.

Effective November 19, in-person visitations for families of Llewsac Lodge (Supportive Care), the Nursing Center and Ross-Worthen (Memory Care) Residents are on pause. Scheduled visitations in designated outdoor spaces (begun June 15) continue to be offered (dependent on permissible weather condition).

All Residents of the Nursing Center, Ross-Worthen and Llewsac Lodge along with 204 employees have received the first dose of the Covid-10 vaccine.

Effective December 16, indoor visits with family and friends living outside of the Village are on pause in the Cluster Homes & Apartments. Family members may bring groceries and other items to be dropped off. During outdoor visits, Residents and guests must remember masks and social distancing. Food and beverages are not allowed.

If Residents of the Cluster Homes and Apartments would like future informational memos regarding the Covid-19 vaccine emailed to a family member, they should contact our Village Clinic with their family member's email address.

One person at a time is allowed in the Village General Store, which is well-stocked with additional offerings.

The Village Clinic is open by appointment for medical needs.

The Village Hair Stylist and Fitness Center are open, all by appointment. The Spa will reopen mid-January.

The Dedham Savings Branch Bank is open, one person at a time.

The Brass Rail and the Abbott Room are temporarily closed.

Anyone entering our community is screened for signs or symptoms of respiratory infection, such as fever, cough, shortness of breath, or sore throat and a temperature check per DPH guidelines.

Employees are wearing masks while at work and continue to be screened daily with temperatures taken.

Residents are our key partners in keeping themselves and others healthy, and we are frequently reminding them of all the preventive recommendations, to wear masks, to wash their hands often, to practice social distancing, to remain at home as much as possible, to leave campus only for necessary errands and medical appointments, and to not congregate or gather on campus. The Residents have been advised to call the Village Outpatient Clinic if they develop a sore throat, cough, fever or shortness of breath or to call with any medical concerns or questions.
