

The Bedford Citizen Elects Three New Board Members

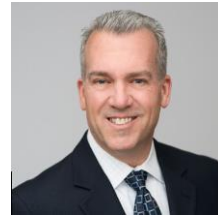

Kim Langway, Tyler Moss, and Chris Golen were elected to *The Bedford Citizen* Board of Directors at the April 8 meeting. Welcomed warmly by their new colleagues, the three members bring skills and perspectives that will help the board guide and strengthen *The Citizen*.

Langway and her husband have two teenagers, and have lived in Bedford since 2005. She values Bedford's abundant conservation land and outdoor recreation opportunities. She and her Bernedoodle, Boots, adore their walks around Fawn Lake.

Langway grew up in Lexington and her mother also resides in Bedford at Carleton-Willard Village. She appreciates Bedford's youth sports coaches who volunteer their time, and the positive impact Bedford Youth Lacrosse had on her son, who will play lacrosse in college.

Langway holds an MBA from Columbia Business School and is a vice president at Fidelity Investments, focusing on digital service and automation. Much of her career in financial services has centered on creating web and mobile app experiences that attract and engage customers, enabling them to make informed financial decisions. Previously, she had worked as an editor on her college newspaper and interned for news organizations.

"The Citizen is a vital information source to the Bedford community, staffed by real reporters who invest time and energy to responsibly cover town news and share findings that would otherwise go unobserved by all but a few," Langway said. "It helps residents stay informed by providing balanced coverage that allows them to decide where they stand on important issues, along with information on how to take advantage of all the town offers. It's been a must-read since its inception, and I support it to ensure it remains part of my news diet."

Moss and his wife moved to Bedford from Jamaica Plain with their two young sons in 2025. He and his wife are originally from Oregon where their families still reside. Moss has published articles in publications such as Condé Nast Traveler and Outside. While working for Writer's Digest, he interviewed and learned from several famous authors, including Andy Weir ("The Martian") and Scott Turow ("Presumed Innocent").

Moss has a master's degree in journalism from Northwestern's Medill School. While his background is in magazine writing and editing, he is now senior vice president of strategic insights at Orchestra, a strategic communications firm. He focuses on brand/channel strategy, audience growth and development, and analytics/measurement for organizations.

"As a former journalist myself, I believe so strongly in the power and value of local news sources, and was so thrilled to learn that *The Citizen* existed when my family moved to Bedford last October," Moss said.

Golen and his wife have an adult son and daughter and live with their two dogs, Rosie and Mazie, in New Hampshire. He arrived in Bedford in 2023 when he became the president and CEO of Bedford's Carleton-Willard Village, a nonprofit continuing care retirement community of over 300 people.

When *The Citizen's* late community reporter, Mike Rosenberg, interviewed him, Golen noted how his close relationship with his grandparents positively affected his job. He enjoys going to the beaches on the Cape and south coasts, and he golfs and skis for fun.

He is a board member of LeadingAge MA, an association of not-for-profit service providers for older adults. He holds a master's degree in aging services from the University of Maryland, and worked briefly in business before starting his career in continuing care.
